# Project Ready To Start! Illustrated Directory

Thanks to the Emily Carr College of Art and Design, CABC will have access to a fully-equipped photo studio and darkroom for the entire summer of 83 commencing June 1st. We have hired Vancouver photographer, Kelly Enno trained in product photography at Langara Community College, who will act as supervisor of photography for the project.

CABC Executive Director, Gail Rogers has been receiving an average of ten letters a day from prospective members who have read about the

directory project in a province-wide series of newspaper advertisements that we placed recently. (CABC acknowledges a generous donation from the **Sterling Newspaper** chain who placed our ad free of charge.)

Alex Tunner and Mary Cooper of the B.C. Research Council have donated their time to CABC to work on the illustrated directory questionnaire and survey which will be mailed out to our members not later than April 29th. CABC volunteer, Fiona Ahrens is looking after this important part of the project.

# HOW TO GET YOUR CRAFT SAMPLE PHOTOGRAPHED AND INCLUDED IN THE DIRECTORY

- 1. You will receive your questionnaire and survey on or before **April 29th**. Please complete and return immediately. This step will be considered your application to be included in the illustrated directory.
- 2. At the same time you will receive a pre-numbered identification label. Please complete it, remove and return the receipt portion (This is an important step for insurance purposes) and attach the tag securely to the craft item you wish photographed. Remember, the initial illustrated directory will be printed in black and white only. When selecting your item please keep this in mind. (However, the photographer will also be shooting-in colour for future publications.)
  - 3. Carefully package and protect the item to a standard suitable for shipment by private courier and personally take the item to your local directory representative. This representative will be identified in your questionnaire and has been briefed on how to get it to the CABC photo studios. The same representative will also receive the craft item back from CABC after it has been photographed and you will be contacted to retrieve your item upon completion.

The CABC awarded Rowan Moore, a fashion design student of Langara College, with the "Outstanding Acheivement Award" at the ceremonies in March.

The Vancouver Museum and Planetarium will be closed for major renovations. As of April 5, the Planetarium will be closed and the closure of the Museum and Gift Shop on April 11. Length of closure is yet not known, but probably into June.

Home Craft Licences - The City of Vancouver requires a Home Craft Licence (\$25/year) for anything made in the home, that will be sold. The licence covers small hand-made goods, not machine made ones and the activity is limited to one person working twenty hours per week. The City of North Vancouver requires a business licence (\$60 - \$72/year) for anything made in the home, that will be sold. However, the occupation must be completely enclosed in the building, must not occupy more than 20% of the floor area and must be conduited by the resident and at most, one other person. Usually such licences are issued to contractors or dressmakers. Richmond Municipality requires a Home Occupation Hobby licence (\$36/year) and issues them for such things as ceramics, fly-making, lamp shade making and seamstressing. There must be no noise, the occupation must be limited to the family residing in the home and there must be no retailing from the home.
