Then determine what you can produce during that amount of time to realize your projected income, in terms of type of item and quantity of each type. If you can have 25% of your stock ready by the time of the Trade Show it's apparently an advantage — at least psychologically, when you are actually taking orders. As you do your calculations you should take into account any retail markets and fairs you might attend during the production period between Trade Show and delivery time. Using these pointers, do your estimates indicate that you will have to work 20 hours a day? If so, can you then determine a more manageable figure for income, or do you have to reconsider the type of product you wish to sell, or are you satisfied all around? The important thing is that you do not take more orders than you can fill. Some of you, by the nature of your craft and what you've chosen to do with it, are not going small and has a limited market. number of Carl Drew, President of P.E.I.
