
### **CALL FOR WRITERS**

Hilde Gerson recently celebrated her 80th birthday in style at a major party organized for her by her children and attended by over seventy friends. We wish a happy birthday to Hilde, who was brought into this world on November 30th, 1913 in Elberfeld, Germany (at that time a twin city to Wupperfeld, but the two have since consolidated under Wupperfeld's name).

"I know you have to fill up space in your newsletter..." was one of Hilde's impish remarks when she was approached for an interview "Don't make it too long...people won't read it" was her final recommendation. Well, despite her modesty, we think Hilde's accomplishments as a textile artist, and her stamina as a CABC contributor are worthy of much praise and celebration.

As some of you may already know, Hilde was the CABC bookeeper for almost seventeen years. What you may not know is that she was one of the founding members of the Association, and attended the first CABC meeting at the Maritime Museum in 1972.


When Hilde joined the CABC as bookkeeper in the 70's, she earned fifty dollars a month; money she could call her own. She remembers fondly how she and Gail Rogers, CABC Executive Director of eighteen years, worked literally face to face throughout that time, as their desks were less than ten feet apart. Although Hilde had been a practising textile artist for some time when she became bookkeeper, she hadn't discovered this art until after her move to Vancouver in the 50's.

Hilde married and settled in Canada in 1944, starting a family shortly thereafter with her husband Wolfgang, whom she'd met in London, England while he was an Architecture student. In 1956 Hilde and Wolfgang moved to Vancouver with their children Martin, Ann, Erika, and Kate. It was a few years after this that Hilde began to weave, and she hasn't stopped since. She remembers taking six lessons with Hilda Roy, who was one of the few people teaching weaving in Vancouver at the time. These first lessons set the foundation for Hilde; she purchased a loom, and throughout the years has taken workshops with Peter Collingwood, Irene Walker, and Else Regensteiner, to name just a few.

Hilde has taken on a substantial number of commissions and has exhibited her work at the National Gallery in Ottawa ('66-'67), the Vancouver Art Gallery ('74), the Portland Art Museum ('73), as well as a number of places in the Lower Mainland. In 1973 she won 1st prize in the Tapestry category at the 16th Exhibition of Canadian Handweaving held in Vancouver. Today people can sit in beautiful chairs created by Francis Lemieux and adorned with Hilde's woven upholstery, found on the second floor of the CABC building on Granville Island. The chairs enhance the serene and airy space of the building, which was designed by Wolfgang Gerson in 1984/85.



JAMES KOESTER James graduated with Honours from the sculpture department of Emily Carr College of Art and Design in 1988. He is an artist, sculptor and freelance designer who works predominantly in metal. Besides many solo and group shows, he has executed commissions in furniture, sculpture, signage, railings, screens, props and jewellery for private, commercial and corporate clients.

JEANNE MORROW Jeanne attended the Art Institute of Chicago in 1969, and Emily Carr College of Art Design from 1987 to 1990 as a part time student. After a personal spiritual experience in 1988, she left ECCAD to explore the historic and personal imagery of the angel. After completing a series of twelve paintings she began to lift the image off the surface of the composition, placing it freely in the environment, combining in a literal way the historic spiritual image with the present time and place.

MIGNON SMIENK Mignon majored in science and has painted textiles since university days. She has painted in the gyotaku technique for many years and currently uses a variety of techniques (block printing, hand painting and sponging) in her painted surfaces. She specializes in creating textiles for the home but also paints commercial commissions.

GINA VERSTER Gina is a multi-media artist and is originally from Borneo. She came to Canada to continue her higher education and graduated from the University of British Columbia with a BA in Fine Arts. In the past few years she has concentrated mainly on painting, but has also made forays into other modes of artistic expression such as jewellery. Most recently she has been rescuing wooden bowls and transforming them with paint and gilt into objets d'art.
