Executive Director's Message Cherryl MASTERS

am very proud to present to the members the recently elected Board of Directors of the CABC. This is an inspired team and over the past several months we have been diligently carving away a strategic plan for the organization to encourage growth for craftspeople and the crafts community for the next few years. We have re-focused our vision which clarifies the direction of the association and forms the basis of our plan. In brief, we are focusing more on you, the members, and designing our programs based on your needs. After several planning sessions we re-defined the association as "a network of craft professionals dedicated to the development of excellence in crafts". We invite all who support this mission to learn and participate.

Our Annual General Meeting attracted a small crowd of members to assist with our business matters. The seminar afterwards drew in a greater crowd and provided useful information on exporting hand-made work to the United States (Exporting to the USA by Border Brokerage, March 25, 1999, Holiday Inn Downtown Vancouver). Ken Block and Bill Murphy delivered a presentation, provided packages of information and were available to answer questions. I was overwhelmed by the unique experiences many of you have had when trying to move your work from Canada to the United States. As we muddle through the wonders of border crossing. I encourage you all to contact these people when shipping - they are a very good

A new pilot series of interactive discussions is being launched to address some of the questions many of you have. The aim of the series is to connect makers with resources to help you develop professionally. Please refer to the section and sign up for some of the four series we will be presenting. As a pilot series we welcome feedback so we can measure this program for its effectiveness and make changes accordingly. A summary of each presentation will be disseminated through Craft Contacts and eventually through our website for people who cannot attend. This is a model which can be adopted by people in other regions, all you need is a group of people with a common discussion topic, a place to gather (a member's studio, community centre, guild, etc.) and a spokesperson from the area you wish to learn about. In my experience, the people we contacted were only too happy to participate and offer information for free or for some non-monetary exchange.

To address the broader issues of career development in the cultural sector, the CABC is part of a Cultural Sector Steering Committee addressing human resource related issues in the cultural sector. As part of the committee, we will be identifying needs and resources, expanding resource and access to information and developing a support mechanism for Cultural Human Resources for BC artists. This project was initiated by the Vancouver Cultural Alliance and involves many cultural partners representing all arts disciplines from the province. The outcome will be the BC Cultural Sector Information, Resource and Referral Centre - a more effective way of collecting and disseminating information for cultural workers and artists.

We are entering into a very active period of programming which I trust will benefit many. I invite you all to participate, discover, share and enjoy!

Catalogue **Art Resources**

Vancouver, is developing an Art Resources Catalogue. The catalogue is a list of skilled artists and artisans who bid on small projects in the City. The goal is to capture artistic input on routine production activities around the city, including projects which are too small to warrant a broad competition. There will be a call for submissions from the artistic community for inclusion in the catalogue around the end of May, early June. The City of Vancouver offers several Public Art programs including Community Public Art, Private Development Projects, Civic Projects and an Artist in Residence Program through the Parks Board. The City also offers an Artist Residency Award which awards occupancy of an artist live/work studio at 272 East 4th Ave., rent-free for a period of three years and will be offering an Artist Studio Rental Opportunity which grants occupancy of an artist live/work studio at 428 West 8th Ave. at approximately \$325/month for a period of three years, once the building is complete in the Fall of 1999.

There are also Public Art Programs established in Richmond, Surrey and Kelowna.







Profile

I was born in Vancouver and lived in Vancouver, Calgary, Regina, Winnipeg, Toronto, Hamilton and St. Catherine's. I am married to Nora, with 3 children (Robyn, Bill & Andy), and 5 grand-children. My working life was spent in Sales Management in the food industry with Burns Foods, Canada Packers, Good Host Foods, Nestle' Enterprises and Canterbury Coffee Corporation. This work enabled me to travel extensively in Canada from Victoria to St. John's, Newfoundland and many major cities in the USA.

My artistic life started in music with piano studies. This was difficult to continue with my travels which led me to start painting and drawing. 

Of major interest to all crafts people in BC will be the new "Oceanside Summer Festival of the Arts & Crafts". The Festival will be held bi-weekly during July and August. This will be a superb venue for craftspeople to set up their displays, tents, etc. and be able to capitalize on the great increase in Oceanside population in the summer.

Memorial Avenue, directly across from City Hall. There will be Gallery displays at the Arts Council all summer. Each Sunday evening from 7:00 - 9:00 pm the Sunday Jazz Concert is held, featuring Ron Hadley at the piano. This event is gaining in popularity each week.

One of the principles built into the Festival will be that only HAND CRAFTED/HAND MADE goods and wares will be allowed. This will be closely scrutinized by a committee to ensure the quality and authenticity of the work.

We encourage all visiting crafts persons/artists/musicians to spend a few days with us. There is a multitude of crafts people/studios/galleries to visit and there is nowhere better than our beaches, woodlands and mountains in which to do some of your own work.
